# <u>Duty First</u> Hazzan Rabbi Ira Rohde

The various rules regarding the Kohanim, the officiating priestly tribe; may be hard to appreciate, but one salient point comes through clearly: no disturbances of any kind may be allowed to keep the priests from performing their duties with a military-like regularity, discipline and precision. Nor is this type of discipline achieved in a vacuum: It is facilitated by an entire lifestyle whereby such an exclusive devotion and fealty to duty at all costs is cultivated. The stark choices that have to be made to facilitate this type of lyfestyle may at times be considered cruel, bordering upon the ascetic, but the lifestyle itself is, of course, part of the discipline.

In a few weeks I will be marking 25 years of attending and officiating at daily services twice a day, every single day, at Shearith Israel. True, I'm occasionally off by a couple of minutes, and I have my complaints about this life, but overall I'm grateful for having been given this chance to devote myself to such a disciplined way of life. I never imagined I'd be able to keep this up for all this time. But the very discipline itself is tremendously strengthening. That's what devotion to "duty first" gives us: great tenacity and strength. An acquaintance of mine, "Born to Run" author Chris McDougall, has a new book and a new program he's been pushing. He's been sponsoring a program which gets the homeless up to run every morning at 5:30 am. He says we all have the capacity to be "everyday heroes," if we cultivate ourselves with such discipline. And mostly it involves just getting up early, day after day, keeping at it, not allowing the less-important to sidetrack us or make us loose focus. And that involves cultivating a disciplined routine, such as we have at our daily minyanim, our equivalent of the daily sacrifices of old. Such a disciplined way of living, putting duty first, gives strength, longevity, and vibrancy to life, gradually molding even the ordinary man into a hero.
