DEBAR TORAH: VAYISHLAH —Z. EDINGER, SHAMASH—

In this week's *Parasha*, the Torah records that Jacob purchased a plot of land near *Shekhem* for 100 "*keistahs*."

וַיּקן אָת־חֶלְקַת הַשָּׂנָה אֲשֶׁר נֵטָה־שָׁם אָהַלוֹ מַיָּד בְּנִי־חַמְוֹר אֲבִי שְׁכֶם בָּמֵאָה קשִּׁיטָה:

The parcel of land where he pitched his tent he purchased from the children of Hamor, Shechem's father, for a hundred kesitahs.

The Septuagint translates *kesita* as αμνών, "amnon", a Greek word for lambs. Similarly, Onkelos uses the word []— Hurfan, the Aramaic word for lambs. It is certainly possible that Jacob made a payment "in kind" – by bartering lambs from his flocks to purchase a field near *Shechem*.

Payments in the biblical times would not have been made in coinage as we know it today. Coinage was only introduced about the 7th century BCE. But transactions of value certainly took place even in very ancient times. These transactions were not made with coins but rather with pieces of precious metals, such as copper, silver, or gold, which were weighed and used as barter in return for agricultural produce or other goods.

In Ancient Egypt, the word for ox was occasionally used to refer to a standard weight that took the form of an ox. A relief from the tomb of *Paheri* (c. 1380 BCE) depicts gold rings being weighed against a weight in

the shape of an ox head (image below.) Therefore, it is also possible that the "lambs" mentioned in our verse are not literally lambs, but rather a standard weight – i.e. "a lamb" of a gold or silver.

The Targum Yerushalmi and Targum Pseudo-Jonathan use the word מֵרְגַלִין meaning "pearls" or "gems." While the



Midrash and Talmud interpret *kesitah* as a type of small coin. *Shadal* (Luzatto) and other modern commentaries point to a possible relationship to the Arabic word — which means equitable or fair payment.

The precise meaning of the word *kesitah* was lost already in antiquity. But the importance of the Torah describing this payment is clear. This piece of property near *Shechem* is a part of our most ancient ancestral homeland. It was owned by Jacob even before going down to Egypt, before the Exodus and before Joshua's conquest of Canaan. This land near *Shechem* was purchased by Jacob for good and valuable consideration, a fair payment of 100 *Kesitahs* to be precise.


