Nothing, I think, would be so likely to effect this, as to your sect particularly, as the more careful attention to education, which you recommend, and which, placing its members on the equal and commanding benches of science, will exhibit them as equal objects of respect and favor. I salute you with great respect and esteem. (Signed) THOMAS JEFFERSON.

Copy of a letter from John Adams, Quincy, July 31, 1818.

Sir, — Accept my best thanks for your polite and obliging favour of the 24th, and especially for the Discourse inclosed. I know not when I have read a more liberal or a more elegant composition. You have not extended your ideas of the right of private judgment and the liberty of conscience, both in religion and philosophy, farther than I do. Mine are limited only by morals and propriety. I have had occasion to be acquainted with several gentlemen of your nation, and to transact business with some of them, whom I found to be men of as liberal minds, as much honor, probity, generosity and good breeding, as any I have known in any sect of religion or philosophy. I wish your nation may be admitted to all the privileges of citizens in every country of the world. This country has done much. I wish it may do more; and annul every narrow idea in religion, government, and commerce. Let the wits joke; the philosophers sneer! What then? It has pleased the Providence of the "first cause," the universal cause, that Abraham should give religion, not only to Hebrews, but to Christians and Mahometans, the greatest part (Signed) JOHN ADAMS. of the modern civilized world.

The Second Mill Street Synagogue and the Founding Fathers By Z. Edinger, Shamash

Shabbat HaGadol is the anniversary of the consecration of Shearith Israel's second synagogue building, the *Second Mill Street Synagogue*. It housed our congregation from April 17, 1818 until April 13, 1833.

At its dedication, Mordecai Manual Noah gave a lengthy address in which he extolled the United States as a beacon of religious freedom: "[F]or the first time in eighteen centuries, it may be said that the Jew feels he was born equal, and is entitled to equal protection." It was because of this toleration that, according to Noah, the new synagogue needed to be built. "From the attractions of light and liberty which our dear country holds forth to the persecuted of all nations, many of our people have emigrated from Europe, and their increasing number made it necessary for their accommodation, that we should enlarge our place of worship."

Afterwards, Noah sent a copy of his remarks to many of our founding fathers. Below are some of the responses he received:

Copy of a letter from Thomas Jefferson, Monticello, May 28th, 1818.

Sir, — I thank you for the Discourse on the consecration of the Synagogue in your city, with which you have been pleased to favor me. I have read it with pleasure and instruction, having learnt from it some valuable facts in Jewish history which I did not know before. Your sect, by its sufferings, has furnished a remarkable proof of the universal spirit of religious intolerance inherent in every sect, disclaimed by all while feeble, and practised by all when in power. Our laws have applied the only antidote to this vice, protecting our religious, as they do our civil rights, by putting all on an equal footing. But more remains to be done; for although we are free by the law, we are not so in practice; public opinion erects itself into an Inquisition, and exercises its office with as much fanaticism as fans the flames of an Auto da fe. The prejudice still scowling on your section of our religion, although the elder one, cannot be unfelt by yourselves; it is to be hoped that individual dispositions will, at length, mould themselves to the model of the law, and consider the moral basis on which all our religions rest, as the rallying point which unites them in a common interest; while the peculiar dogmas branching from it, are the exclusive concern of the respective sects embracing them, and no rightful subject of notice to any other; public opinion, needs reformation on that point, which would have the further happy effect, of doing away the hypocritical maxim of "intus et lubet, foris ut moris." [Latin for "within as pleases, without how maintained" i.e. do as you please in private, but in public behave as is customary.]
