Sephardic custom is to refer to the Sabbaths of the Three Weeks by the opening words of the particular haftarah read on that day. The three are: Shabbat Dibre, Shabbat Shim'u, and Shabbat Hazon. All three are chanted in a dirge of lament, although each ends on a note of comfort.

Customs of Mourning For Jerusalem

As a sign of mourning for the destruction of the Temple in Jerusalem, it is customary to avoid eating meat, trimming or shaving one's hair, or to wear new or freshly laundered clothing, during the week of the Fast of Ab. Ashkenazim observe this custom from the first day of Ab (a period often called "the nine days.") Sephardim, however, observe customs of mourning only during the week in which the Fast day actually occurs. This year, the Fast of Ab is observed on Sunday, the 10th of Ab. In this case, when the week of the Fast includes only Sunday, it is admirable, but not obligatory, to avoid trimming one's hair during the entire preceding week so as not to enter into the day of mourning freshly groomed. Whichever custom one follows, it is apt to remember the words of our Sages (Ta'anit 30b): כל המתאבל על ירושלים זוכה ורואה בשמחתה—Whoever mourns for Jerusalem will merit to share in her joy.
