Passover, the Festival of our Freedom, is celebrated both at home and in the synagogue. A festive atmosphere permeates the synagogue beginning with the first night of the holiday on Friday evening (starting at 7:00 PM). Evening dress (tuxedos or evening gowns) were once the norm on the first night of every holiday. Although this sartorial convention has waned in recent decades, we encourage you to wear something special to mark the holiday, and if you were looking for an occasion to pull out your tuxedo, this is the perfect night to do so.

During the evening service, *Kaddish* is sung to special melodies and the *Hallel* is chanted after the *Amidah*. During Musaf of the first day of Passover, we recite *Tefillat Tal* (the Prayer for Dew). The much loved melody for "*Lekh leShalom Geshem*" has its origin in the 16th century Italian madrigal "La Mantovana." This melody is the common musical ancestor for our *Tal* melody, for Smetana's *Moldau*, and for Israel's national anthem, *Hatikvah*.

Beginning with the second night of the Holiday, we count the 'Omer - and sing Psalm 67 (*Lamenatseah Binginot*) to a bright and cheerful melody. On the Seventh day of Passover (Friday, April 6th), we read the *Shirat Hayyam* (Song of the Sea), which becomes the musical theme of the day. We also celebrate the consecration anniversary of the first Mill Street Synagogue on the Seventh Day of Passover.
