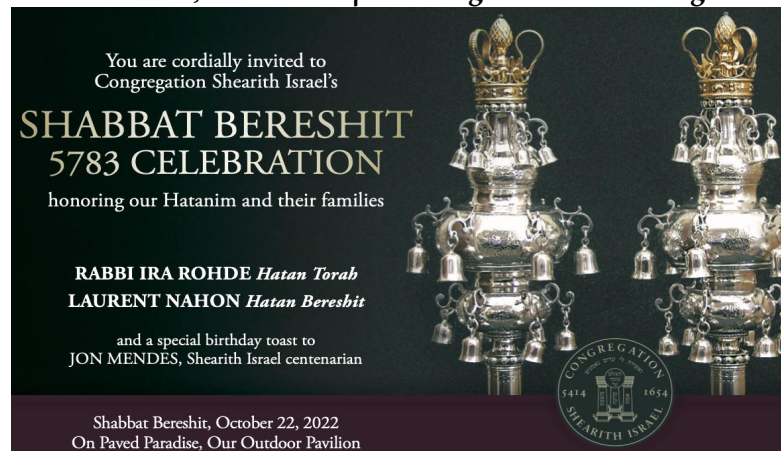

Myer Myers: the preeminent Jewish silversmith of the colonial era; congregant and Parnas of Shearith Israel; creator of three of Shearith Israel's priceless sets of historic *rimonim*, admired by experts and collectors of American Judaica. All three sets will return home from their temporary abodes at the New-York Historical Society, the Boston Museum of Fine Arts, and at the Touro Synagogue, respectively, and before re-loaning them, Shearith Israel will be exhibiting them as part of a very special Friday Night Lights talk by Rabbi Soloveichik.
