# Prosperity Makes Us Forgetful & Ungrateful, Even for the Most Extraordinary

The circumstances whereby Pharaoh's Butler lost and regained his prominent post were by any account extraordinarily providential. That he would have risen to attain such a post in the first place, in a position to be so close to Pharaoh and hence influential, in a totalitarian society, would have been quite unusual and worthy of gratitude, despite all the pressure it put him under. But then to have been summarily dismissed along with his fellow artisan in the food service, the Baker, and for the both of them to have been incarcerated suddenly together, due to some whimsical suspicion of Pharaoh, was a remarkable change in fortune. Then for the two colleagues to have had these portentous dreams, clearly significant and seemingly close in character, was noteworthy. And their failure to find satisfactory interpretations of these clear portents must have left them deeply baffled and concerned. The Butler should have been deeply indebted to Joseph for his auspicious and favorable prognostication, particularly when contrasted with the ominous end Joseph augured for the Baker. And then, when both prognostications were fulfilled, indeed, on the very same day, the day marking the astrological conjunctions of Pharaoh's birth, with one of the two artisans restored to former glory and one summarily executed, all at the whim of Pharaoh: That should have made the Butler thank his lucky stars for the Providence which spared him his colleague's fate and raised and restored him from the depths of the pit of incarceration to be seated upon high in the council of the powerful. The Butler owed an immense debt of gratitude to Joseph and to Joseph's God for such pearls of enlightening and illuminating prophetic insight, for which he should have been eternally grateful. The Butler should have immediately mentioned Joseph's case to Pharaoh. His own unjust incarceration should have inspired the Butler to have pity upon Joseph as well as upon all those unjustly incarcerated in Pharaoh's prisons and to seek legal review and redress of their cases.

But as soon as the Butler is restored to his position and his prosperity once again, he totally forgets. He forgets Joseph and he forgets all of God's Providence over him. Instead of gratitude inspiring him to remember God and seek God's Justice for all, he forgets all the downtrodden and unjustly imprisoned with whom he served time. Only when Pharaoh needs help with a portentous dream of his own does, when Joseph suddenly might be "useful," does the Butler finally "remember" Joseph. Our Parasha ends with this terrible dereliction and basest ingratitude of the Butler's his "forgetfulness." In next week's Parasha the Butler confesses these ingratitudes and failures of recollection before Pharaoh as his "sins."

And what causes such forgetfulness and its concomitant ingratitude? Clearly it is the very prosperity to which the Butler had attained and to which he was restored and the mindset which that engendered, which required, it is true, devotion to his duties, but also wiped his mind clean of any recollection of his former state and any gratitude for having been rescued. Having now been elevated, he has forgotten his former downtrodden state and the downtrodden state of his fellows who suffered unjustly with him. Deuteronomy and the Prophetic books will later rail against those who become prosperous and fat in satiety and abundance and forget all sense of thanksgiving to God and identification with the cause of the downtrodden. All this is being prefigured in this narrative of the Butler's forgetfulness of Joseph. Israel also has been the subject of many prophetic and portentous visions, some of which are quite vexing. And Israel has experienced being cast down to the pit, as well as wondrous salvations. When Israel regains our prosperity, we have had the natural tendency to become fat and lazy, ungrateful and even rebellious to God. It is to rectify this natural tendency to forget how bad things were, to serve as a counterweight to this natural ingratitude and to make us thankful for every redemptive step of God along the way, that a great many of the Torah's laws are framed.
